

Dr. Wendy Cukier is a professor of Entrepreneurship and Strategy at the Ted Rogers School of Management and Founder of the Diversity Institute. She is a coauthor of the bestseller "Innovation Nation: Canadian Leadership from Java to Jurassic Park." She is leading, in collaboration with Ryerson's Brookfield Institute for Innovation + Entrepreneurship and the Ted Rogers School of Management, the newly-announced Women's Entrepreneurship Knowledge Hub, funded by the Government of Canada to create a more inclusive innovation ecosystem. The Diversity Institute and Magnet are also part of the Ryerson-led Future Skills Centre, a partnership with Conference Board of Canada and Blueprint-ADE and more than 150 supporting organizations.

Wendy chairs the Board of Women's College Hospital, and the Information and Communications Technology Council's Diversity Committee, and serves on the boards of a number of other organizations. She is a recipient of the Governor General's Meritorious Cross, one of Canada's highest civilian honours. She was named one of the University of Toronto's 100 Alumni Who Shaped the Century, was selected in 2013 as one of Canada's Top 25 Women of Influence and in 2010 was selected as one of 25 Transformational Canadians by The Globe and Mail, La Presse and CTV. She received the Black Business Professional Association's Harry Jerome Diversity Award, and the Canada Pakistan Business Council named her the 2017 Female Professional of the year. Recently she received Ryerson's Social Innovation Award. She holds an MA, an MBA and a PhD, and honorary doctorates from Laval and Concordia.
